PECAS Centres are meeting points where people can share information and ideas about

- Planet (Environment)
- Economy
- Community
- And
- Self

A PECAS Centre consists of:

- Display area to showcase research and project work relating to any issue of sustainable development (Planet, Economy, Community) And/or lifewide learning (Self);
- Chat wall to enable feedback and further sharing of information and ideas about the current display;
- Local share drive archiving of past display materials and ideally online interaction with PECAS Centres in other locations.
